

CONCORD statement on the final MFF 2021-2027 negotiations outcome

In July 2020, after two years of extensive negotiations on the Multiannual Financial Framework 2021-2027, the European Council has reached an agreement which, in certain aspects, can be considered an ambitious recovery plan for the EU.

CONCORD, however, deeply regrets that this is not the case for Heading VI: Neighbourhood and the World, which was decreased to €98,4 billion. This amounts almost exactly to the current EU external action budget (Heading IV - Global Europe under the MFF 2014-2020 combined with the European Development Fund). With just 10 years left to meet the Sustainable Development Goals and in the midst of a global sanitary and climate crisis and unprecedented pressure on civil society and human rights, the fact that the level of ambition has stagnated goes beyond disappointing - it is tantamount to a dereliction of duty and is at odds with the EU's strong political ambitions to be a leading global actor. In these challenging times, the EU's stated support to the achievement of agreed international commitments and objectives, in particular the 2030 Agenda and the Paris Agreement and to partners' recovery from COVID-19, should have been matched with ambitious funds.

Within Heading VI, major cuts were made to the Neighbourhood, Development and International Cooperation Instrument (NDICI), for which the total budget now amounts to €70,9 billion (compared to the EC 2018 proposal of €79.22 billion). This has direct implications on the NDICI programmes, in particular the thematic programme, which suffered disproportionate cuts (10.6% compared to the 2018 EC proposal; while the emerging challenges cushion for instance was only cut by 5.9%). This programme is meant to support human rights and democracy, civil society, peace and security, and global challenges worldwide. A budget of €5,6 billion is clearly insufficient to fund such a large set of key priorities. Concretely, it will jeopardize the EU's ability to promote multilateralism, to provide funding to multilaterals and global (health) initiatives, to implement the EU's human rights action plan, and to provide support to civil society and local communities.

CONCORD would like to remind the European Institutions that cuts were made to NDICI under the presupposition it would benefit from a €15 billion top-up from Next Generation EU (NGEU), which did not come to fruition due to legal issues.

Therefore, CONCORD calls on the European Parliament to change this trend by advocating for an overall increase to Heading VI of the NDICI; focusing especially on thematic programs. This could be achieved by decreasing the flexibility cushion. This would also be in line with the European Parliament's mandate for the trialogue negotiations, which called for an increase of the thematic programme to €9.741 billion.
